WHEREAS, there are approximately 900,000 law enforcement officers serving in communities across the United States, including the dedicated members of the Mansfield Police Department; and

WHEREAS, nearly 60,000 assaults against law enforcement officers are reported each year, resulting in approximately 16,000 injuries; and

WHEREAS, since the first recorded death in 1791, almost 20,000 law enforcement officers in the United States have made the ultimate sacrifice and been killed in the line of duty, including one member of the Mansfield Police Department; and

WHEREAS, 273 new names of fallen heroes are being added to the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial in Washington D.C. this spring, including 117 officers killed in 2014 and 156 officers killed in previous years; and

WHEREAS, the service and sacrifice of all officers killed in the line of duty will be honored during the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund's 27th Annual Candlelight Vigil, on the evening of May 13, 2015 as part of National Police Week; and

WHEREAS, May 15 is designated as Peace Officers Memorial Day in honor of all fallen officers and their families and U.S. flags will be flown at half-staff in remembrance,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, David L. Cook, Mayor of the City of Mansfield, Texas, join with members of the City Council to proclaim May 10-16, 2015, as

NATIONAL POLICE WEEK

in Mansfield and encourage residents of our community to show their appreciation and gratitude to the Mansfield Police Department for their dedication to our city and the safety of our citizens.
