WHEREAS, continuing this tradition through joining together, celebrating our community's diversity and creating an environment of healing, Mansfield is providing a strong foundation for future generations to be united in common goals of strengthening and building our city, and

WHEREAS, this year's Mansfield Juneteenth celebration, one of the oldest in the state, will be held on Saturday, June 20, at McClendon Park and will include a community walk through the historical areas of West Mansfield, and

WHEREAS, we express our gratitude for the dedication of the Norwood family and others who work to keep this important tradition alive in our community,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, David L. Cook, Mayor of the City of Mansfield, Texas, join with the members of the City Council, and herby proclaim June 20, 2015

JUNETEENTH DAY

in Mansfield and encourage all citizens to participate in these activities and embrace the mission of reconciliation and unification this celebration represents.
