- **WHEREAS**, the City of Mansfield has remained committed to providing the best in emergency medical care for its citizens by staffing its fire stations with highly trained and skilled firefighter/paramedics, and
- **WHEREAS**, these professionals provide emergency care to residents 24 hours a day, seven days a week, dramatically improving the survival and recovery rate for those who experience sudden illness or injury, and
- **WHEREAS**, the American College of Emergency Physicians is recognizing the dedication of these skilled professionals during this year's National Emergency Medical Services Week with the theme "Called to Care," and
- **WHEREAS**, Mansfield residents enjoy significant peace of mind knowing that Mansfield Fire Rescue's personnel are on duty, providing our community with the best in emergency medical care,
