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Resolution - Consider the Adoption of a Resolution Establishing a Moratorium on the Issuance of Permits for the Processing or Approval of Site Plan Applications for Restaurant and/or Food Service Establishments whose Business Model Provides that more than Ten Percent of their Projected Business is Directed at Providing Food Service to Customers in Drive Thru Lanes to Permit a Study to Determine what Performance Standards Might be Appropriate to Address Land Use Impacts on Adjoining Properties Created by these Business Operations

City Attorney Steve Wood made brief comments and answered Council questions.

A motion was made by Council Member Lindsey to approve the following resolution:

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MANSFIELD, TEXAS, ESTABLISHING A MORATORIUM ON THE ISSUANCE OF CONSTRUCTION PERMITS AND/OR THE RECEIPT OF SITE PLAN SUBMITTALS FOR RESTAURANT OR FOOD SERVICE OPERATIONS WHOSE BUSINESS OPERATIONS TRADITIONALLY PROVIDE THAT MORE THAN TEN PERCENT OF THEIR BUSINESS IS DEVOTED TO DRIVE THROUGH LANE SERVICES, SUCH MORATORIUM TO EXTEND FOR A PERIOD OF 120 DAYS DURING THE PREPARATION OF A STAFF STUDY TO DETERMINE WHAT, IF ANY, SAFEGUARDS AND PERFORMANCE STANDARDS SHOULD BE ESTABLISHED TO PROTECT THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE IN THE ESTABLISHMENT AND OPERATION OF THESE FACILITIES, PROVIDING FOR A VARIANCE PROCESS IN THE EVENT OF HARDSHIP
