WHEREAS, the City of Mansfield participates with other communities throughout the region in a North Central Council of Governments project called the Texas SmartScape program, which promotes water conservation goals by hosting classes and a demonstration garden planting, including one located at the Chris W. Burkett Service Center; and,

WHEREAS, Texas SmartScape is a part of the Mansfield Water Utilities H2Grow program, the outdoor education portion of department's Water 360 strategic education plan, and

**WHEREAS**, this program focuses attention on water conservation and water quality benefits while also educating homeowners on creating beautiful and attractive landscapes that show Mansfield at its best,
