#### 6. CASH FLOW STATEMENT

17-2373 Cash Flow Statement - June 30, 2017

Cash Flow was distributed to Board members at the meeting with revised numbers (copy on file in the Parks and Recreation Director's office). A month-to-month sales tax comparison through June was also provided.

Matt Young, Parks and Recreation Director, informed the Board that there is a 7% increase in sales tax revenue over last year for this month and about a 4% increase for the year. Matt also informed the Board of upcoming changes in revenue projection figures in order to provide figures that more acccurately reflect actual receipts based on historical data. Matt also provided updated project figures for the Fieldhouse reflecting close to \$300,000 in project savings. Matt informed the board that these savings will be used to finish up replacing sod areas, grading the property and trails, as well as building a retaining wall around the lights at McKnight Park East. Any project savings remaining will be rolled into the FY2017-2018 budget as will be the case for design costs for the Downtown Restroom project, Philip Thompson Soccer Complex, Walnut Ridge Park, and the Dog Park. Matt also informed the Board that under Capital Expenditures, capital purchases are listed as per our discussion to purchase seven (7) pieces of capital equipment from FY2016-2017 funds in the amount of 139,245 during our Special Meeeting on July 17, 2017. This expenditure will be well within our budget due to savings from projects and operating costs.
