Mansfield Commission for the Arts Grant Award Recipients - The Lot Downtown, Legacy High School Theatre, and Mainstage Classic Theatre

Cultural Arts Supervisor Rosalie Gilbert gave a brief update on the Mansfield Commission for the Arts efforts to raise money to provide grants. She recognized current and past board members thanking them for their hard work and dedication putting grant policies and procedures together. She introduced the Board President Robert Putman, and Board Members Christopher Bryant and Danielle Phillips, and a member of the Grant Review Committee Emilie Buske. STAFF COMMENTS

City Manager Report or Authorized Representative

Current/Future Agenda Items

Mr. Chandler addressed comments made during citizen comments regarding the Shops at Broad stating staff will make sure the developer complies with the Planned Development Standards. He expressed appreciation to Park Superintendent Toby Fojtik and the park crews, and Big League Dreams staff for their hard work cleaning the fields after the event.

Deputy City Manager Joe Smolinski gave an update on the Shops at Broad development mentioning Academy Sports was scheduled to open in September as well as At Home. He mentioned the Mansfield Starcenter had been turned over to the Dallas Stars on July 1, 2018 and made brief comments regarding the marquee sign. He gave an update on Broad Street construction.

Staff Update Regarding Water Quality Report - Joe Smolinski and Jeff Price

Joe Smolinski gave an update on the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality's regulatory requirement of cities to provide an annual Water Quality Report. He spoke in detail about the requirements of the report as well as other topics put in the report as extra. He acknowledged staffs committment to putting out as much information as possible to inform residents. He discussed the cost of printing the report and answered Council questions.

Staff Update Regarding Citizen Survey Related to Trash Service Proposals

Deputy City Manager Peter Phillis provided a brief update on the citizen survey regarding the trash service proposals.
